American Legion Memorial Day Parade May 26

The American Legion Post 690 is sponsoring a Memorial Day Parade and other related activities on Monday, May 26th beginning at 10:00 AM with a service at Hillside Cemetery on Smith Street in Palatine.



After a short ceremony at Hillside Cemetery, the parade will start at 10:15 AM at Cornell Avenue and Smith Street. The route will be north on Smith Street, east on Robertson Street, south on Brockway Street and then east on Wood Street to the Veterans Memorial in Community Park.

Following the parade at 11:00 AM there will be a short program at the Veterans Memorial, another ceremony at the Legion Memorial in Towne Square at 150 W. Palatine Road beginning at 12:15 PM, immediately followed by a final ceremony at Union Cemetery at 72-74 Greeley Street all in Palatine.

Buckle Up Memorial Day and Everyday

The Palatine Police Department is reminding drivers to buckle up as part of the national “Click It or Ticket” campaign. This high-visibility seat belt enforcement initiative runs from May 16 to May 27, coinciding with the Memorial Day holiday.

“Seat belt use should be an automatic habit for everyone,” said Commander Christopher Stearns. “It’s not just safe; it’s the law. During this campaign, law enforcement agencies will be working together to ensure the message reaches all drivers and passengers. Buckling up is the simplest way to reduce injury or save a life in a crash.”



A key focus of the “Click It or Ticket” campaign is nighttime enforcement, as Illinois crash data indicates higher rates of unrestrained fatalities at night. Notably, in 2023, 72% of

male passenger vehicle occupants killed in crashes were unrestrained, compared to 28% of female passenger vehicle occupants.
