

Fall 2021 Parkway Tree Replacement Program and 50/50 Tree Planting Program

The trees included in this brochure are the species available for the Parkway Tree Replacement Program and 50/50 Tree Planting Program. They have been chosen for their hardiness in this climate and their resistance to disease. This brochure has descriptions and photos of each species available for planting this season.

The cost associated with each tree is for the 50/50 Tree Planting Program. This Program is for homeowners that wish to add a new tree to the parkway adjacent to their property on a 50/50 basis, with the resident and the Village sharing the cost of the tree. The cost of the tree includes planting and a one year replacement guarantee.

If the Village removed a parkway tree within the past year, it will be replaced at no charge to the homeowner.

1. Moraine Sweetgum (*Liquidambar styraciflua*) is a moderately fast growing, excellent shade tree known for its unique star-shaped leaves, which are 4" to 8" long and turn into a kaleidoscope of brilliant yellow, orange, red or purple shades in the fall. Spiny 1½" fruits change from green to brown in late summer, and persist on the tree into winter. When mature, bark is grayish brown and deeply furrowed with narrow ridges. It prefers moist, well drained, acidic soil, but is tolerant of salt and drought.

Habit: Conical when young, develops into oval as it matures.

Mature Size: Height: 60' - 75'
Spread: 40' - 75'

Color: Summer: Dark to medium glossy green
Fall: Yellow, orange, red or purple

2. Espresso Kentucky Coffeetree (*Gymnocladus dioica* 'Espresso') is a large shade tree with a bold, attractive branch structure similar to elms. 'Espresso' is a male cultivar that is seedless and fruitless. Long spike-like clusters of lightly scented greenish-white flowers bloom in late spring. Double compound, finely textured leaves offer filtered sunlight to plants and turf below it. It has good heat, drought, and cold tolerance and has no serious insect or disease issues. It adapts to a wide variety of soil conditions, but strongly prefers full sun.

Habit: Oval to vase-shaped with upright arching branches.

Mature Size: Height: 40' - 50'
Spread: 30' - 35'

Color: Summer: Bluish-green
Fall: Yellow

3. Frontier Elm (*Ulmus parvifolia* 'Frontier') is a hardy, fast-growing, hybrid elm cultivar with excellent resistance to Dutch Elm Disease and elm yellows. Leaves are small, a lustrous dark green in the summer, and an outstanding reddish-purple color in fall, rather than the typical yellow of most elms. It rarely flowers and produces no fruits or seeds. Bark is relatively smooth and gray-green. It tolerates poor soils and drought conditions, and also has moderate resistance to elm leaf beetles.

Habit: Upright, pyramidal.

Mature Size: Height: 30' - 40'
Spread: 20' - 50'

Color: Summer: Dark green
Fall: Reddish-purple to burgundy

4. Exclamation! London Planetree (*Platanus x acerifolia* 'Morton Circle') is a large, long-lived, fast-growing tree, typically adding 3' in height a year when young and gradually slowing to 12" to 18" a year until mature. Leaves are large, up to 12" long and across, with three lobes, similar to maple leaves. The peeling bark is its most outstanding feature, in mottled shades of green, tan and brown. It peels off in large pieces, revealing young bark in shades of cream and white underneath. It tolerates a wide variety of soil conditions and is resistant to drought, flooding, and road salt.

Habit: Upright pyramidal.

Mature Size: Height: 55' - 65'
Spread: 40' - 50'

Color: Summer: Medium green
Fall: Yellow

5. Yellowwood (*Cladrastis kentukea*) is a medium- to large-sized tree with a moderate growth rate. Large, hanging clusters of fragrant white flowers appear in late spring on mature trees and are 8" to 14" long, resembling wisteria. Flowering tends to occur in alternate years, with heavy flowers one year and lighter flowers the next. Flowers give way to flat seed pods that mature in September to October. Gray to brown bark is smooth and beech-like. It tolerates both dry and wet sites and road salt, but prefers well-drained soils and full sun.

Habit: Broad, rounded.

Mature Size: Height: 30' - 50'
Spread: 40' - 55'

Color: Summer: Bright green
Fall: Yellow

6. Prairie Expedition Elm (*Ulmus americana* 'Lewis & Clark') is a medium-sized tree with outstanding Dutch Elm Disease resistance and a rapid growth rate of 3' to 4' annually until mature. Large, serrated dark green leaves provide excellent shade. Insignificant small green flowers appear in spring before the foliage emerges and later give way to single-seeded samaras, maturing in April to May. It tolerates most soil types and urban pollution and adapts to both wet and dry areas, but requires full sun.

Habit: Vase-shaped,
umbrella-like.

Mature Size: Height: 55' - 60'
Spread: 35' - 40'

Color: Summer: Dark
green
Fall: Yellow

Trees for Under Power Lines

The following trees are designed specifically for planting underneath overhead power lines. By planting species which will not grow into utility lines, we can avoid severe pruning by the utility companies and these trees will maintain their natural shape and beauty.

7. Japanese Ivory Silk Lilac (*Syringa reticulata*) is known for its creamy white, fragrant flowers that bloom in dense clusters in late May to early June for about a two week display. Small, yellow-green fruits do not attract wildlife and persist on the tree. Smooth, dark red bark adds winter interest. It is a low maintenance tree and considered the most pest-resistant of lilacs. It will tolerate poor soil conditions.

Habit: Oval or pyramidal when young,
spreading to rounded as it matures.

Mature Size: Height: 20' - 30'
Spread: 15' - 20'

Color: Summer: Dark green
Fall: No color change

8. Cornelian Cherry Dogwood (*Cornus mas*) is a small, flowering tree with long-lasting, bright yellow, star-shaped flowers that bloom in round clusters in early spring. Bright cherry red fruits ripen in mid-summer are a favorite of birds and can be used for making preserves. Dark grey to reddish-brown scaly bark offers winter interest. It is a fairly adaptable tree that tolerates a wide range of soil conditions and some drought, and is relatively pest and disease free.

Habit: Oval to round.

Mature Size: Height: 15'-25'
Spread: 15'-20'

Color: Summer: Glossy,
medium green
Fall: Yellow-burgundy

–**After your new tree is planted, please help it survive by keeping it watered for at least the first year after planting.** Trees should receive 1 inch of water per week, and need to be watered if there is not adequate rainfall.
